Pastor's Message

"For in six days the I ORD made heaven and earth, the sea, and all that is in them, but rested the seventh day; therefore the Lord blessed the Sabbath day and consecrate d it."

Recently a friend sent me an article he had read and thought it was very interesting and good, and after reading it I agreed. It was an article by a church "guru," who has spent his career after many years in the parish trying to help congregations and pastors keep focused on their ministry, and their callings rather than getting bogged down in the "we've always done it that way" syndrome that most of us get bogged down in from time to time.

This article, however, was a little different. In our society we are used to constantly doing things. People work at their jobs, careers, a lot. We do not get a lot of time off, and when we do we find ourselves "working" on our homes, doing laundry, shuttling children to/from this practice to that one. The "American" way is to DO. If you aren't doing, you are loafing. The way to get ahead is to DO. The problem with that is that when we focus ourselves on DOING all the time, we believe we are DOING it all on our own.

One of the quotes from Bill Easum's article was this, "Jesus Was Always on Vacation: Leading from Freshness Rather Than from Frazzle." As we know from our continued reading of Scripture Jesus was always trying to get away, taking time out, setting himself aside in the presence of God to be refreshed. Jesus understood the concept of Sabbath rest. He understood that, "The Sabbath was made for humankind, and not humankind for the Sabbath." (Mark 2:27)

As Easum points out even Jesus understood the concept that we need to be refreshed by God to DO. Without that refreshment we are just spinning our wheels, trying to DO on our own, and getting nowhere.

God, from the very beginning, has set up 14.286% (1/7) of our time for us to REST. Now this isn't our only rest time. This is one day out of seven to rest from ALL our DOING! A day when DOING is not at the top of our list, but instead we are called to BE. BEING instead of DOING means that we take time with God (usually that means worshipping, prayer, reading scripture, etc.). BEING instead of DOING means that we take time with our family, not DOING anything, not getting things DONE, but BEING together, having fun together, resting and relaxing together, building up our relationships with each other.

Our time of rest is for us to be refreshed by God's Spirit so that when we begin to DO again, we can be focused on Godly DOING rather than a pursuit after our own desires. When we fail to take that rest, when we fail to humble ourselves in God's resting arms, we lose that connection we have to the holy and life giving Spirit that is what truly gives us and our families' life. Let us realize that God is calling us to DO less, and BE more, so that what we DO DO is what God wants DONE!

it was needed. The loan was started in 2014, (it took a while to get everything in place). As of August 1, 2023 the entire loan plus interest was REPAID!!! It took Redeemer 7 years and 3 months, which means it was ahead of schedule!

The Chosen is an American <u>Christian historical drama</u> television series created, directed and co-written by filmmaker <u>Dallas Jenkins</u>. It is the first multi-season series about the life and ministry of <u>Jesus of Nazareth</u>. Primarily set in Judaea and Galilee in the 1st century, the series centers on Jesus and the different people who met and followed or otherwise interacted with him.

While *The Chosen* pulls its characters, themes, and plot lines from the Bible, it is not a one-to-one comparison.

The Chosen stays true to the details that are in the text of the New Testament. Each episode takes artistic license to fill in the many blanks where the text does not go into detail, but this artistic license is all feasible considering the details that are provided.

Season 1:

The first season is set in Galilee where <u>Jesus</u> starts to build a group for <u>his</u> <u>ministry</u>, inviting several people with different backgrounds. As he performs his first miracles, Jesus calls the redeemed woman <u>Mary Magdalene</u>; the stone mason <u>Thaddeus</u>; the choir member <u>Little James</u>; the fishermen Simon, Andrew,

<u>Big James</u> and <u>John</u>; the caterer <u>Thomas</u> and vintner Ramah; and the <u>tax</u> <u>collector Matthew</u> to follow him. Jesus also meets with <u>Nicodemus</u>, a <u>Pharisee</u> who is perplexed by the acts of Jesus. The season culminates with the group traveling through <u>Samaria</u>, where Jesus launches his public ministry after revealing himself to <u>Photina</u>, a <u>Samaritan</u> woman.
