RLC Annual Congregational Meeting January 28, 2024

An annual meeting was held at Redeemer Lutheran Church on Sunday, January 28, 2024. The meeting was held in the Centennial Room, with 24 voting members present.

Call to Order: The meeting was called to order by Council President Russ Pingrey at 11:22 am.

Opening Prayer: An opening prayer was led by CALM Bobbie Krager.

<u>Council Minutes of January 18, 2023:</u> The minutes were printed and in the Annual Report packet. Ruthi Fitzgerald moved, and Inez Briggs seconded to accept the minutes. All approved.

Annual Committee Reports: The committee reports were printed and in the Annual Report packet. Karen Buckley moved, and Charles Houser seconded to accept the reports. All approved.

Financial Secretary Report/Treasurer's Report: Bill Hinkley was out of town, but his report was printed in the Annual Report packet. Rich Watson was covering for Bill Hinkley The Finance Secretary Report and the Treasurer's Report are the same item. Russ Pingrey did ask for motions, so there were 2 motions for the same report. Ruthi Fitzerald moved and Pat Watson seconded to accept the Financial Secretary Report. All approved. Judy Mica Guerin moved and Cathiann Birtch seconded to accept the Treasurer Report. All approved.

Proposed budget: Russ Pingrey announced that the proposed budget was printed and in the Annual Report packet. He suggested that those in attendance look at it before discussion. Rich Watson reminded people that Bill Hinkley had gone over the budget a few weeks earlier at coffee hour. He did go over a few things, particularly the fact that this year's budget is lower than previous year's.

Other Business:

<u>RLC Council:</u> Ruthi Fitzgerald informed us that Marylou Rutkowski has had to resign from Council. She thanked Marylou for her time on Council, her service to church, and everything that she continues to do. She also asked people to think about being on Council. If anyone is interested, please let her know. At the May 2024 meeting we will vote to fill the vacant seat. <u>Rebecca Circle:</u> Ruthi Fitzgerald stated that the Rebecca Circle has \$228.42 left in their account. She spoke with Nancy Krager and Barbara Rader who said that they would like the funds to go to a memorial or something important for the church. During today's meeting there was a discussion on the purchase of a defibrillator, and Barbara Rader stated that she would like the funds left in Rebecca Circle transferred to the defibrillator fund.

<u>RRF</u>: Ruthi Fitzgerald stated that she is working on having a gathering/party to celebrate the paying off of our RRF loan, Redeemer's 135^{th} anniversary, and the Sanctuary Service 10th anniversary. She is looking for a date in June, after Our Saviour goes to one service and Pastor Jeff will be available to attend. She thanked everyone who contributed to the RRF fund which allowed us to pay off the loan early – 7 years only. Fantastic!

<u>RRF Phase II</u> Ruthi Fitzgerald also announced that we are continuing to collect funds for the next large project. She said people have suggested handicapped accessibility or air conditioning. She said that she asked Bill Hinkley for a wish list of things to be done around the church. She has the list, and will bring it up at Council meetings for discussion before it is brought to the congregation at the May meeting. She again thanked everyone for contributing to the RRF fund.

Voting Items:

Synod Assembly Voting Members. Synod assembly will be held this year in Syracuse Monday June 3 and Tuesday June 4. Redeemer is able to send 2 people as voting members, and will pay the assembly fees and hotel fees.

Judy Mica Guerin is currently on Synod Council; and as a Synod Council member her assembly fees are picked up by Synod, but not the hotel.

Any person who wishes may attend the assembly, paying their own assembly fees and hotel fees. Russ asked the congregation if anyone was interested in attending. Inez Briggs, Paul Talbot, and Cassie O'Dell were all interested. Paper was passed out, and our voting members voted for 2 people to attend. Inez Briggs received 19 votes, Paul Talbot 18 votes, and Cassie O'Dell 11 votes. Inez Briggs and Paul Talbot will be Redeemer's representatives at Synod Assembly.

<u>Return to the Proposed Budget:</u> Russ Pingrey asked if everyone had enough time to review the proposed budget and if there were any last questions before the vote. A motion was made and seconded to approve the proposed budget as submitted. All were in favor.

Other business continued: After the voting, we returned to other businesses:

Shrove Tuesday Pancake Dinner: There was a discussion on having a Pancake Dinner on Shrove Tuesday, the night before Ash Wednesday. It had been suspended because of Covid. Russ Pingrey asked if we would like to have one, and if anyone would be willing to cook. Judy Mica Guerin and Joe Guerin volunteered to cook, and others volunteered to help. There was general discussion. A time was decided on 5:30 - 6:30 on February 13, 2024.

<u>Ash Wednesday lunch assembly:</u> Lunches for Ashes To Go will also be assembled on Tuesday, February 13th. People were wondering if they can do the lunches and stay for the dinner. Judy Mica Guerin said lunch assembly will be at 3:30.

Raffles and Defibrillator: It was announced that we currently have \$157 collected for the current raffle. There was a discussion about where the raffle money was going. Rich Watson said that the raffle money was being split between the Defibrillator and the Organ Fund. This led to a discussion about the defibrillator and how much money we have for the purchase of one. Rich Watson was not able to give a specific amount from the information he had available. Ruthi Fitzgerald made a motion that the raffle money go to the defibrillator fund, and Judy Mica Guerin seconded. All approved.

Boundaries and Grief courses: Judy Mica Guerin said she had received some interest from people about having another course on Boundaries, and also one on grieving. She asked if people were interested in either. Receiving positive responses, she said she would look into making arrangements for them.

Adjournment: Russ Pingrey asked if there was any more business before the meeting was adjourned. Hearing none, he adjourned the meeting at 11:55 am.
